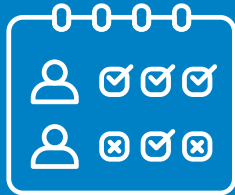

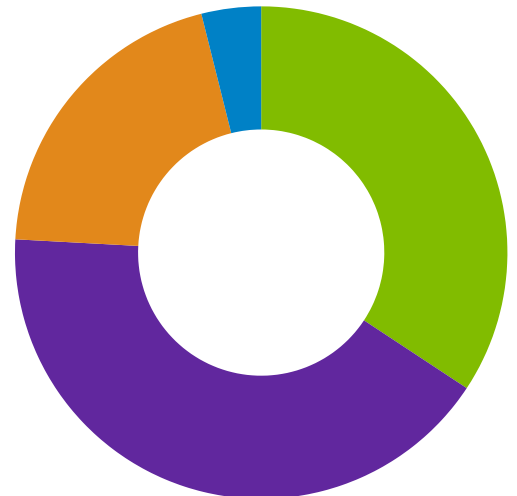

OUR IMPACT



BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES

In 2024 our Behavioral Health Team received the national Roxanne Spillett Award for Trauma-Informed Practice & Youth Well-Being, recognizing their exceptional integration of trauma-informed care and commitment to youth mental health. The team serves over 2,000 youth annually, providing access to critical mental health resources.

95% of youth say that “if something is hard, I keep working at it”

90% of youth say that being at Club is fun

86% of youth report having trusted relationships with Club staff



SUMMER OF DISCOVERY

During this unique summer program, middle and high school students have the opportunity to explore diverse careers through hands-on activities and field trips. Participants engage with industry experts, tour workplaces, and develop practical skills, helping them make informed decisions about their future careers.

CHARACTER & LEADERSHIP

We're fostering the next generation of leaders and helping Club members grow into responsible, caring citizens. This year, we launched a summer Youth Advisory Council, increased participation in Torch Club and Keystone Club countywide, and expanded Workforce Leaders and Junior Volunteers programs across multiple Clubs to build career skills and promote youth responsibility.

ACADEMICS & TUTORING

Support from BGCLC plays a crucial role in helping youth achieve academic success. We provide homework assistance, hands-on activities, and opportunities to explore new subjects. These programs not only improve grades but also increase high school graduation rates and prepare youth for their future success.

99% of youth increased reading scores during the school year AND prevented summer learning loss in reading*

87% of youth increased math scores during the school year*

84% of youth prevented summer learning loss in math**

2020 YOUTH OF THE YEAR MILAYO GARNER DISCOVERS HER PATH

Milayo Garner, an alumna of our Sage Homes Wellington Club, is forging ahead toward a career in pediatric medicine. She credits her time at BGCLC for helping to prepare her for what it takes.

In Milayo's six years at Club, she took an active role, participating in community projects and Torch Club, a small-group leadership and service club for youth ages 10-13. In 2020, she won the Boys & Girls Clubs Larimer County Youth of the Year competition. Although the COVID pandemic ended her Club experience early, she left well equipped for her postsecondary journey.

According to Milayo, the skills she learned at Club impacted both her educational and professional careers.

"Club programs gave me a lot of professional experience, which has prepared me for the jobs I've had since then. I also learned how to present myself professionally, and how to speak in front of a crowd."

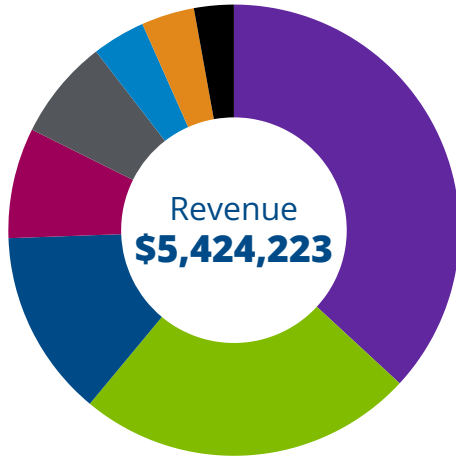
Inspired by her experience working with younger Club members, Milayo plans to fulfill her childhood dream of practicing pediatric medicine. Currently, she is studying biomedical sciences with a concentration in anatomy and physiology at Colorado State University (CSU).

She is also a part of the Maximizing Access to Research Careers program at CSU. Currently, she is researching canine cancers with CAR-T cell therapy, which, according to Milayo, can translate to treating human cancers. Milayo will continue her research and graduate from CSU in 2026. She plans to further her education and enter a combined MD/PhD program.

"I met many people who inspired me on my journey into high school, college, and beyond. I learned that I had an impact in my community, and I could be the change that I wanted to see."

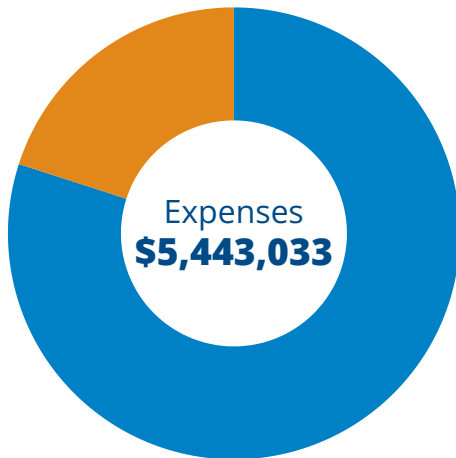
OPERATING FINANCIALS
