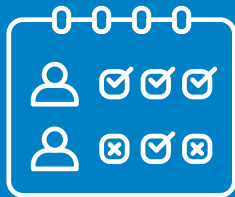

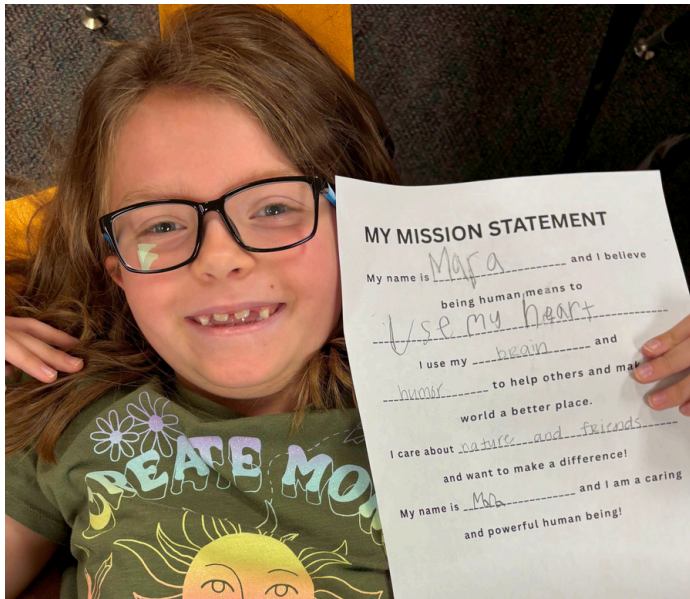

OUR IMPACT



TRAUMA-INFORMED PRACTICE

All of our staff are trained to understand the "why" behind youth behaviors and use that knowledge to create a safe and supportive space where every Club member can thrive. In addition, our nationally-recognized Behavioral Health Staff provide Social Emotional Learning groups, one-on-one therapy, early identification assistance, and local resource connections at no extra cost to families.

94% of youth report feeling safe at Club

93% of youth report that adults at Club listen to and understand them

75% of youth know ways to calm themselves down



TEEN ENGAGEMENT

BGCLC is redefining the teen experience by focusing on giving them more of what they actually want: a space where they have a real say and programs that match their interests. By putting youth leadership at the center of everything from our Teen Nights and Summer of Discovery to the Keystone Club, we are offering more than just programs. We're creating opportunities for the next generation to find their voice, build their skills, and take ownership of their future.

WORKFORCE READINESS

During our Summer of Discovery program, middle and high school students have the opportunity to explore diverse careers through hands-on activities and field trips. Participants engage with industry experts, tour workplaces, and develop practical skills, helping them make informed decisions about their future careers. Each career-themed week gives participants an opportunity to *Hear About It, See It, and Do It*.



ACADEMIC SUPPORT & ENRICHMENT

Support from BGCLC plays a crucial role in helping youth achieve academic success. At the core of our academic efforts is Boys & Girls Clubs of America's Project Learn, a comprehensive framework that integrates learning activities into daily programming. We provide homework assistance, hands-on activities, and opportunities to explore new subjects. These programs not only improve grades but also increase high school graduation rates and prepare youth for their future success.

92% of youth improved their math scores during the school year*

CHARACTER & LEADERSHIP

We're helping Club members grow into responsible, caring citizens. Torch Club and Keystone Club are leadership and service programs for youth ages 11-18 that encourage entrepreneurialism, civic engagement, and community responsibility.

Through these opportunities, youth gain leadership skills and a practical understanding of how they can make a difference in their community.



LOVELAND-PULLIAM KEYSTONE CLUB ATTENDS NATIONAL CONFERENCE

Our future is bright with the next generation of leaders. For the first time in 7 years, the Loveland-Pulliam's Keystone Club attended the National Keystone Conference in Chicago. To qualify, our group completed several in-Club projects to support academic success, teen recruitment and retention, career exploration and development, and fundraising. They also had to complete a cumulative 200 hours of service.

Connecting with each other and other BGC organizations, was a large focal point of the trip. Watching our teens connect with themselves as individuals was extra special. We witnessed our group navigate traveling without their families for the first time, taking Instagram photos for each other, overcoming fears, and trying deep dish pizza for the first time together.

Creating long-lasting friendships, opportunities and memories also stands out as a big takeaway. We gained inspiration from other Keystone Club projects to grow the impact in our community. The teens also used the financial knowledge gained from Club in a breakout session on financial literacy, winning the competition and a prize.

Collaborating to grow our impact in the world was the focus on the final day. Highlighted and exemplified by our collaboration with BATA Sole, a local Chicago nonprofit, we stepped out of our comfort zones, cleaning shoes and engaging in collaborative leadership-building activities.

This was definitely one of the most rewarding and impactful experiences we have had.

LOVELAND YOUTH CAMPUS

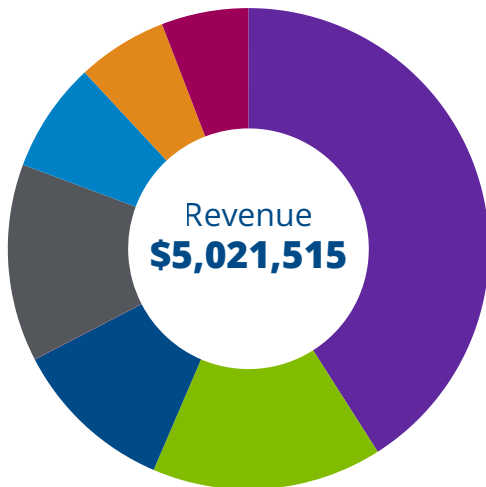


The Loveland Youth Campus reached a major milestone in 2025 with its grand opening in September. Community members, donors, and nonprofit staff joined together to celebrate the collaborative community hub that is home to Boys & Girls Clubs of Larimer County and several nonprofit partners, all actively serving Loveland youth and families on-site.

Owned by BGCLC and operated in partnership with United Way of Larimer County and Teaching Tree, the campus provides comprehensive programming for youth ages 0–18. Programs span early literacy, academic support, and career exploration, while on-site partners offer wraparound services including mental health counseling and family support.

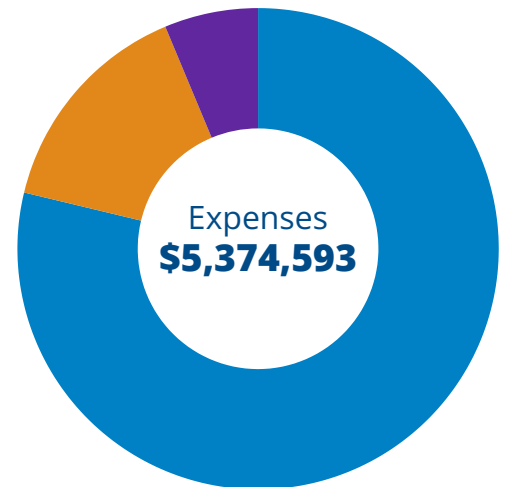
